Gardening with Dahlias Presented by Betsy Szymczak Just as peonies have been called the "Show Girls" of spring gardens, dahlias have come to be known as the "Royalty" of fall. Betsy Szymczak will introduce you to the history of dahlias and show you how to select dahlia tubers, where to plant them, and how to water and fertilize them. To stake or not to stake, to dig or not to dig: these are the questions! You will learn how to store and overwinter tubers, as well as how to wake them up and make cuttings.

Betsy Szymczak is an avid vegetable and flower gardener who started growing dahlias 15 years ago. Today, she is a member of the American Dahlia Society (ADS) and the New England Dahlia Society, as well as an ADS accredited Judge. She also grows begonias as houseplants and is an American Begonia Society Certified judge. She has judged begonia sections at the Boston and Newport flower shows. Betsy is an immediate past president of the Natick Garden Club.

A Certified Massachusetts Master Gardener, Betsy is a retired college professor who has taught clinical microbiology at several Boston area colleges and universities for over 35 years.



So, if anyone is interested in purchasing a Poinsettia, let me know. The list is below of the color and number available of each color. \$30.00 a pot (4 large plants in each pot).

Let me know if you are interested in these holiday beauties. They will be delivered to me in the first or second week in December.

- 2 Beauty Marble: most saturated color of all the marble poinsettias
- 2 Brilliant White: bright white pointed bracts
- 2 Enduring Pink: light pink pointed bracts, medium green foliage
- 4 Enduring Red/White: combo of 4 plants, 2 red, 2 white
- 5 Imperial Red: bright red massive flowers, dark green foliage
- 10 Jubilee Red: traditional red, medium green foliage

BIRDIE BITS



At the last Sudbury Garden Club meeting that I missed waiting for Verizon to come and repair my phone due to a lightning strike and a tree down, several members asked Marilyn why they are seeing fewer birds at their feeders. An article arrived a few days later from Wild Birds Unlimited addressing that very question.

Seeds, nuts, insects and even berries are in abundance this time of year, which means our backyard birds are eating more from the natural world and less from our feeders. This happens to some extent every year at this time. In years when plants produce copious amounts of seeds and nuts, birds and other animals become less dependent on our feeders. The converse is true when fewer seeds and nuts are produced. There must be a lot of natural seeds and nuts this year because everyone has been mentioning seeing fewer birds at their feeders and asking why so it is not only our members.

Not to worry, the birds will return to our feeders in greater numbers once the weather turns colder. Birds need to eat more in colder weather, especially high fat foods, which help them stay warm. When you find yourself reaching for an extra sweater, the birds will be back looking for an extra serving of delicious and nutritious bird food.

Following Marilyn's wonderful article about the Hummingbirds last month, I marveled at the female Hummingbird that was at my feeder constantly and actually began to look a bit larger. Every time I thought she had flown South, there she was again until last week



when she started her journey. I will leave the feeder out for another week, and I will miss seeing them until spring.
